Singita Kwitonda Lodge

◀ On 178 acres at the edge of Volcanoes National Park in northwestern Rwanda, this new lodge sits close to the habitat of one-third of the world's remaining mountain gorillas. The eight suites (and a private villa) are done up in worldly African elegance. From \$1,495 per person per night, including meals and laundry service, but not the \$1,500 gorilla trekking permit; Ruhengeri, Rwanda.
